GFSI Presentation

Civic Tech and Employment Accelerator Pilot Project

- ACOA and PELT recognized Civic Tech for accelerating employment and have provided funding to formalize the program
- Funding is available for a Provincial Coordinator, Community Coordinator and up to six volunteers
- Three individuals, Yu Ren, Ahmed Shaltout and Kate Walsh, have found full-time employment through this program



Affordable Housing Committee

- Housing Needs Assessment
 - The assessment explored conditions across the entire spectrum of housing in Fredericton, including home ownership, multi-unit rental housing, and homelessness
- Affordable Housing Strategy
 - Strategy built off the Housing Needs Assessment includes 13 recommendations
 - At this time the full report has not been released to the public

Basic Income Coalition

- Every province in Canada except New Brunswick has a Basic Income Coalition
- GFSI has established the foundation for the NB collation, including a brand, website, G-suite, social media pages and launched a dispelling myths campaign
- Currently in the process of finding coalition chair, a request has been put forward

Growing Civic Tech

- Efforts to expand Civic Techs in communities across the province including in
 - Saint John started in April 2020 led by Randy Hatfeild and Human Development Council
 - Moncton launched in September 2021 led by Debbie McInnis
 - Bathurst is the next location with an information session planned for August 2022

Building Community Framework for Social and Digital Innovation

- How GFSI services could be replicated and used in three NB communities over the course of a year
- One Francophone, First Nations and rural community
 - Bathurst and Kingsclear First Nations selected
 - o The last community is undecided, considering Charlotte County, Doaktown or St. Stephen
- This project is in collaboration with All In Agency
 - o All In has expertise in human design which will aid in the city's strategic planning
- To date have met with the CAO of Bathurst and all of Bathurst's department heads
- Team member, Tim Hogan is from Bathurst and has connections to the community working on the project
- \$20,000 micro-grant is provided to each community upon the completion of the project

Meal Planner Presentation

- Meals Made Simple is a project for Greener Village to offer meal plans to those restrained by budget and time
- A Meal Planner admin from Greener Village will meet with clients and create meal plans based on dietary restrictions and the unique needs of the Client
- The software has been developed for both Admin User and Client experience
- When the Admin User logs in they see a list of meals with details regarding whom the meal is assigned to, where it is categorized and a description of the meal including ingredients used, quantity and total estimated costs per meal
- Admin User has access to a meal catalog, where they can search for meals and then drag and drop their selection into a day of the week calendar
- Greener Village can upload Youtube videos of each recipe created by Chef Yves,
- Recipes can be printed
 - Questions:
 - Is this program publicly available?
 - Not yet as it is in the development stage and it is not meant for the public it is being developed for Greener Village.
 - o Membership based?
 - No, this has been created for Greener Village with the goal to create a free accessible meal planner option as other meal planner programs are costly
 - O How is the cost per meal determined?
 - Costs are based on products needed and not how much you use of the item. For example, 1 cup of milk out of 1 litre, this makes the price estimate not accurate but meets the request of Greener Village
 - Will it be helpful to clients?
 - Yes, Greener Village surveyed clients and results found that this tool would be beneficial for them and was stated as something their clients wanted.

CIN Presentation

Community Inclusion Network Transition

- Local Governance Reform Act Passed by NB Legislature, effective January 2023
- ESIC will now be contracting with the Regional Service Commission to host CIN's in each region
- RSC 11 Fredericton board approved their new contract with ESIC on June 7th
- Transition date, hiring of a CIN Coordinator, determination of a Steering Committee and development of a budget is still to be determined
- Audited financial statements to be provided to ESIC's auditors 30 days prior to the transition

Overview of Past Initiatives

- Community engagement
 - Partnering for impact, Good Food. Regional Plans
- Capital City Cycle
 - This program has provided skill-building, bike distribution and social inclusion to the Fredericton community



- Imagination Library Jemseg Lions Club
 - "A book a month club" for families
 - Introduction to carpentry for highschool students to build bookcases for families
- Community Food Smart
 - A bulk food buying program to supply food bags at discounted price
 - Supported start-ups throughout the province
 - Newest program to launch iis Burton
- Fredericton Local Food Festival
 - Education on food security and gardening
 - Advanced opportunities for skill training and social inclusion
- Hayes Urban Teaching Farm: Regenerative Farm Certificates
 - 18 week intensive learning course teaching individuals small-scale, regenerative agriculture, incorporating Indigenous knowledge of the land
- Community Food Mentors Program
 - Development of training program for individuals with a shared interest in food security and community building
 - o Graduates have gone on to lead local food initiatives and foster social inclusion
- Children's Community Garden Projects
 - Engage children by planting and growing food
 - o Provided skill-building, food access and social inclusion
- ConnectFredericton.ca, Youth Leadership Training
 - Facilitated the connection of individuals looking to get involved in their community with organizations looking for volunteers
- Community Garden Investments
 - o Investments made in a geothermal greenhouse and numerous community gardens
- Fredericton Food Rescue
 - o Provides access to food and social inclusion
 - Photo of donation of over 2000 pounds of apples to Greener Village with transformed that into vacuum sealed packs of apple sauce
- Public Health Canada Pilot: Market Greens
 - One of 10 sites selected for a national pilot, aimed at providing data on the impacts of food coupon programs
- Covid Responses: Provincial
 - 60k Emergency response funding through CFS
 - o 60k Emergency response funding through Nourishing Minds NB
 - Supplied free food to those in need during the pandemic



- Volunteer Drive Solution: Urban Rural Rides
 - Volunteer driver program that provides affordable transportation to seniors and low-income families
 - o Operational in Cambridge-Narrows, Hanwell, Kingsclear, Oromocto and New Maryland
- Partnerships for Impact
 - Engaged in discussions at the national and provincial level to advance poverty issues, working in partnership with:
 - National Coalition for Healthy School Food
 - Good Food Organization: Community Food Centers Canada
 - Food For All NB
 - Tamarack Institute: Communities Reducing Poverty
 - Atlantic Coalition Basic Income Now
